What was the first record you bought? Apache Indian - Nuff Vibes EP (featuring the classic Boom Shack-A-Lack). I bought it on cassette from HMV in Cardiff.

What was the first gig you attended? I think it was East 17 in Cardiff Ice Rink – I was so cool!

What's the best gig you've been to? Karma (a singer/songwriter from South Africa) in the Half Moon in Putney. She was playing with a full band and it was just at that perfect moment for me where her album had come out and I was in that zone of being obsessed with it. More recently I saw KT Tunstall do a wonderful solo gig at St Davids Hall.

What's the best gig you've played? That would have to be Swindon & Wiltshire Pride last summer. It was the biggest crowd I've played to so far and it was such a lovely vibe

What's for the future? My EP Hear Your Voice will be out soon on iTunes, Amazon, Spotify. The lead track Not For Me (Na Na Nah) has a silly, summery video to go with it (featuring Gerry the giraffe!) which I think will be a perfect antidote to the January blues.
